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HOW TO DO A SPLIT BOOTH (Necessary for Premium Booths, optional for any other booth where you SHARE a location)

1. Go into eBudde & select a Booth within eBudde
2. Reach out to other Juliette Girl Scouts at this link to see who is available to help, and/or post on Juliette Facebook
3. Coordinate who is bringing all necessary pieces for booth i.e. table, tablecloth, and TROOP INVENTORY SHEET.

DAY OF BOOTH

Juliette A Brings Inventory & Bank \$\$

Juliette B Brings BACKUP Inventory to pay back cookies for their half of the split.

Work your booth together as a TEAM!

Each taking turn with speaking to customers or making change. Remember it is everyone's purpose to talk to the public to engage and work on your business skills.

At booth close

- Count all inventory
- Count all monies
- Juliette A pays half the monies to Juliette B.

While Juliette B replaces half of the cookies back to Juliette A - based on flavors sold - do not only give the cookies you want vs half of what was actually sold.

EXAMPLE:

100 boxes are sold -> 50 boxes to each Girl Scout

This is \$500 -> split is \$250 each



Whose working together? J-a and J-B



Starting inventory brought by J-A
Always count and place that count here.



A great way to keep your younger girls engaged is have them track each individual box sold using hash marks - they don't know what hash marks are! But not a necessity for older girls who know how to count in 5s!



This is where the Girl Scouts count all the remaining inventory when the booth ends.



This is where the troop who brought the monies and the product pays out 1/2 the monies (J-B to J-A)



This is where you replace 1/2 the cookies in the same amount as monies paid (J-B to J-A)



This is where you as Juliette mentors acknowledge monies and boxes have been handled equitably.
